The Alliance's **September 14 meeting** will be held at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 7PM (6:30 social time), and the program will follow, featuring a demonstration by Eric Miller of his sketchbooking techniques, with time for interactive practice to follow. Members should bring sketchbooks, if they have them! "The inspiration and subjects for my paintings are most often found at my home or nearby," says Miller. "I've found that there are endless sources of interest and beauty there, whether it's something grown in my garden, a small bird sitting on a branch, or an old weathered door. I believe that my best paintings are the ones I feel connected to personally, and that say something about me." Eric Miller earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Art Education from Millersville State College in 1976 and a Master's Degree in Art Education from Millersville University in 1999. He taught art at the secondary level in New Oxford and Littlestown, PA for over 30 years, before retiring in 2010. A member

of the board of directors of the Hanover Area Arts Guild, and a member of the Pennsylvania Watercolor Society and the Franklin County Art Alliance, Miller currently offers watercolor and sketchbook classes at the Council for the Arts. His work is mostly done in watercolor, but he also uses acrylics, oils, and mixed media. He shows and sells his work in area exhibits and galleries.

The Alliance's **October 12 meeting** will be held at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 7PM (6:30 social time), followed by a critique of members' works by Cristin Cash. Since 2012, Cristin Cash has served as Director of Boyden Gallery and the Fine Art Collection at St Mary's College of Maryland, where she oversees and performs all curatorial work, educational programs, collections management and general operations. Dr. Cash joined the Art and Art History faculty of St. Mary's in the Fall 2005, after earning her B.A. degree from the University of California, Santa Barbara, and her Masters and Ph.D. from the University of Texas at Austin. Recent exhibitions include First Person: Contemporary Cuban Art at the Layton Gallery, Milwaukee Institute of Art; Life is Flux: Visualizing Change in Art and Biology; and World Views: The Photographer as Visual Author at the Boyden Gallery. She teaches courses in the Art and Architecture of the Americas from ancient times to the present, World Architecture and Museum Studies.

Opportunities...**Miniature Art 2016 Exhibition**

The deadline is September 30 for Chambersburg Council for the Arts' 32nd Annual "Miniature Art 2016" Exhibition, to be held Nov. 4, 2016 – January 6, 2017. Artists may submit up to 4 works, each with image size no greater than 4" by 6", not to exceed 24 square inches; framed pieces should not exceed 48 square inches (all works must be framed). Original work only will be accepted - no copies - in any fine art media (no crafts, jewelry, photography, laser prints or computer-generated artwork). Sculpture is encouraged, and should not exceed 5" in any dimension. Awards will be offered as follows: Best of Show (\$300) and 3 Merit Awards (\$100 each). A 35% commission will be charged on all sales. The entry fee (for 1-4 works) is \$25; an additional \$15 will be charged for return shipping and insurance on works not hand delivered. ON VIEW**Chambersburg Community Mural Project**

Renowned Philadelphia-based mosaic-mural artist Isaiah Zagar worked with local volunteers to create two murals this summer, with sponsorship from the Art Alliance and many other area organizations and individuals. Zagar was commissioned by Downtown Chambersburg Inc. (DCI) to design and install two large-scale murals on Main Street for the Chambersburg Community Mural Project. The two project sites are at the Main Street Deli, 33 N. Main St (approximately 68 feet wide by 15 feet high); and The Foundry, 100 S. Main St. (approximately 37 feet wide by 15 feet high). The Chambersburg Community Mural Project began when Holly Baker Strayer, an art teacher at Chambersburg Area Senior High School, approached DCI to partner with her to bring Zagar to Chambersburg. Strayer has taught her art students about Zagar's work for years and is inspired by how his work has transformed Philadelphia neighborhoods.

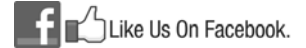

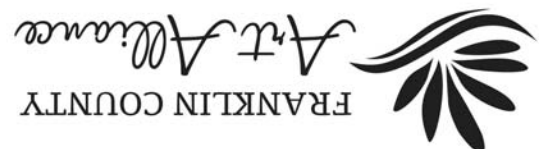
