Freya Qually: Farm Silhouette

The Alliance's January meeting will be held on Saturday, January 12, 1-3pm (12:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 1pm and the program will follow, featuring a demonstration in oils by artist and educator Freya Qually. In 1989 Qually established the studio art department at Penn State Mont Alto Campus where she still teaches, and was the 2005 recipient of the Martha Fisher Award for Excellence in Teaching. She also gives private art instruction, and believes that teaching art is a rewarding process, stimulating new ideas and approaches in her own painting as well.

Qually earned her Bachelor of Arts degree at Gettysburg College and her Master of Fine Arts degree from The American University in Washington, DC. She has completed many commissions, including portraits for the Lincoln Room Museum in Gettysburg and for Gettysburg College. For four years, she was commissioned by The Friends of the National Parks at Gettysburg to paint scenes of interest from the Gettysburg battlefield which were then

printed as note cards for national distribution. She has won many awards throughout her career, both national and regional. She has exhibited in Washington DC, Chicago, and Minneapolis in addition to Harrisburg, Chambersburg, Hagerstown, Gettysburg, and Rehoboth Beach. Her paintings hang in private collections in England, Canada, and Spain as well as Las Vegas, Berkeley, and throughout the east coast.

The Alliance's February meeting will be held on Saturday, February 9, 1-3pm (12:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 1pm and the program will follow, featuring a portrait demonstration by artist Pam Wenger of Dillsburg PA. Wenger has always been drawn to portraits and figurative work, and since retiring from teaching, has fallen in love with portraiture in watercolor. She had taken some art classes in college and some classes at her local art association, but then had the privilege of working with portrait artist Ted Nuttall, and attending sessions with Charles Reid. She work has been shown throughout the Mid-Atlantic region, including the Pennsylvania Art of the State, PA Watercolor Society, and the Baltimore Watercolor Society's Mid Atlantic Watercolor Show. Awards include Best of Show at the 2018 Mechanicsburg Art Center Juried Show; 1st Place in the 2017 Watercolor category of the Figuratively Speaking Show at the Harrisburg Art Association; Viewer's Choice Award at the 26th Annual International PA Watercolor Society Show; and First Place at the Art Center of Mechanicsburg Annual Members Show in 2013. She is both a Board member and signature member of the PA Watercolor Society.

The Cumberland Valley School of Music is looking for an art teacher for their Arts Integrated Preschool initiative with Franklin County Head Start. The position includes weekdays 9:30-11:30, teaching one class on Mondays and 2 classes all other days (3 30-minute lessons per classroom per week) in their Chambersburg classroom, which holds three classrooms of 3-5 year-old children. Three adults will present during instruction (the classroom teacher, the classroom assistant, and the art teacher), to work with approximately 18 children per classroom. Figure Drawing at the Mansion House Art Gallery: The Valley Art Association offers figure drawing each Thursday from 10am-1pm. If you are interested in attending, please contact Elaine Wolfe at ecwolfe@frontier.com or at 304-754-5116 (landline). (If calling on Thursday morning, call before 8:30am.) The sessions usually begin with a sequence of brief poses, followed by 25 minute or longer poses with short breaks every half hour. There will also be sessions when there is one long pose, and participants can change locations around the models/select details, e.g., hands, for closer study, if they prefer to do several studies. The professional model fee is \$20/ hour; shared among six that would be \$10 per artist. The maximum cost per artist will not be more than \$15 per artist. If you are paying by check, the check will be made out to the model.

Chambersburg's Artists' Co-op, The Foundry, now in its 3rd year at 100 South Main Street, continues to welcome applications from new artists. Annual membership fee is now \$75 per year, plus a \$25 application fee which is applied to overall cost upon acceptance. Commission is 40% on sales, but artists can receive lower commission rates if they choose to fulfill workshare hours: 4 hours per month = \$35% commission; 8 hours per month = 30% commission, 12 hours per month = 20% commission. The annual fee goes toward overhead costs of paying rent, utilities, insurance, etc., and commission helps cover day-to-day costs of sales, like swipe fees, promotion, administrative work, etc. Visit www.FoundryArtsCoop.com and scroll down under Membership.

- Entries will be hung at the Old Jail on a first come, first serve basis.


