Meetings

The **Alliance's September 11 meeting** will be held at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 7PM (6:30 social time), and the program will follow, where artist Phyllis Disher Fredericks will demonstrate her process in a program called "Developing ideas and composition for Surrealism". Fredericks' work has been described as peaceful, Zen-like and slightly surreal. A native of northern New Jersey, she has been painting in oils since the age of ten. She received a degree in Painting and Sculpture from the Newark School of Fine and Industrial Arts and has also studied at the Adobe School in Castro Valley, CA and the Scottsdale Artist's School in Scottsdale, AZ. From 1987 -1999 Disher Fredericks was an adjunct professor of art at York College of Pennsylvania where she taught foundation and advanced painting courses. She presently teaches at the York Art Association and is a PA Artist in Residence with the PA Council on the Arts. Disher Fredericks has also served as president of the

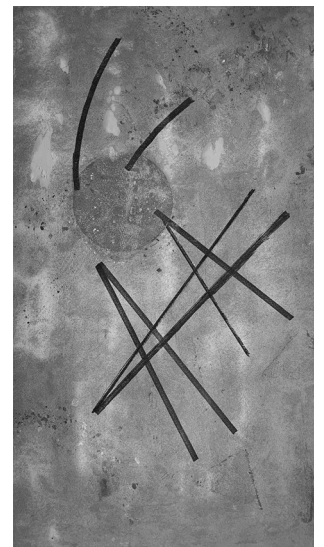
York Art Association Board of Directors, served on the Cultural Alliance of York County Partners Council and curated the Cultural Alliance of York County Governors' Awards for the Arts Exhibition. Her paintings have been exhibited in many solo and selected group exhibits throughout the eastern US and have received numerous awards.

The Alliance's **October 9 meeting** will be held at Grove Family Library. The business meeting will begin at 7PM (6:30 social time), followed by a demonstration of clay monotypes by Hanover artist Andrew Smith. Andy opened the Visual Realia Studio Gettysburg in February of 2019 following a 32-year career as a music teacher. The studio focuses on clay monoprints, teaching and group sessions, but also includes some photography as well. Andy's work has been exhibited at several local arts guilds, juried shows and in a solo exhibit at the Adams County Arts Council in Gettysburg. He is a member of the Hanover Area Arts Guild, where he serves as a board member, and the Adams County Arts Council. He is active in promoting and supporting his community through the *Inside Hanover* project and Facebook page, as well as his local VR Photowalks series. As an outgrowth of his photographic work, he is a Google "Trusted Pro" in the use of 360-degree panoramas for both community interest and business needs.

Council for the Arts' Miniature Art 2019 Exhibition The deadline is September 27 for the Chambersburg Council for the Arts' 35th annual exhibition, "Miniature Art 2019", to be held Nov. 1-December 18, with a First Friday Reception from 5-8pm on November 1st. The Council is located at 81 North Main Street, and can be reached at 717-684-6883 or programs@councilforthearts.net. Artists may submit up to 4 works, each with image size no greater than 4" by 6", not to exceed 24 square inches; framed pieces should not exceed 48 square inches (all works must be framed). Original work only will be accepted - no copies - in any fine art media (no crafts, jewelry, photography, laser prints or computer-generated artwork). Sculpture is encouraged, and should not exceed 5" in any dimension. Awards will be offered as follows: Best of Show (\$300) and 3 Merit Awards (\$100 each). A 35% commission will be charged on all sales. The entry fee (for 1-4 works) is \$25; an additional \$15 will be charged for return shipping and insurance on works not hand delivered. 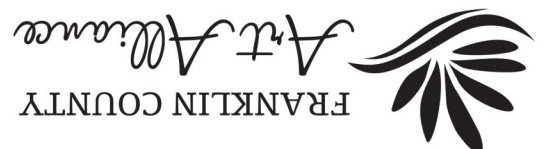
