The Alliance's September meeting will be held on Wednesday September 14 from 7-9pm (6:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 7pm and the program will follow, featuring a demonstration by Harrisburg artist Thom Kulp. Kulp will share a variety of ways to approach abstraction: ways to start an abstract painting and ways to deal with an unsuccessful composition.

Thom Kulp began painting after retiring from the US Postal Service in 2003, taking classes at various art associations. After taking Experimental Mixed Media at the Art Association of Harrisburg with Linda McCloskey, he took over teaching duties for that class, taught it for several years, and also taught workshops and classes at the York Art Association. "I have exhibited and won numerous awards at area exhibitions," he says, "but most pleasing to me is the fact that several of my students have gone on to win awards as well!" Thom currently displays his work at the Perry County Council of the Arts in Newport, PA and the Garth Gallery in Columbia, PA.

The Alliance's October meeting will be held on Wednesday October 12 from 7-9pm (6:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South). The business meeting will begin at 7pm and the program will follow, featuring a demonstration on scratchboard by artist Hector Fernandez. Although he has worked in many different mediums before, his passion is with scratchboard. He loves the detail, realism and the wonderful contrast that is achievable with this medium. A resident of Hagerstown, Maryland, Hector is a Signature Member of the International Society of Scratchboard Artists (ISSA). His work has received awards from the ISSA, Glendale Art Association, Santa Clarita Artists Association, and has been exhibited in several galleries around the USA, Canada and Australia.

Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor and Pastel Painting with Jeff Barnhart will be offered at the Council for the Arts, 103 North Main Street, Chambersburg, from 1-4pm on Mondays, October 10 through November 14th. The usual session begins with gesture poses/sequence of brief poses, followed by 20-25 minute poses with short breaks every half hour. During the second half of the session, we may choose to have a single pose. Artists are welcome to change locations around the models/select details, e.g., hands, for closer study, if they prefer to do several studies. If you need specific pose(s) for an artwork, please let Elaine know in advance, and they will include poses to meet your needs. The professional model fee is \$20/hour; among four artists, that would be \$15 each, preferably paid in cash.

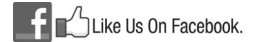

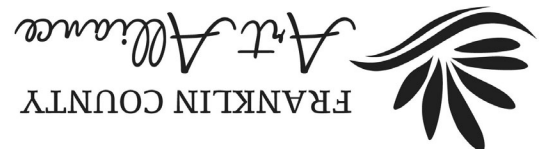
