Kesra Hoffman: Lucas Point Morning

The Alliance's January meeting will be held on Saturday January 11 from 1-3pm (12:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South in Chambersburg). The business meeting will begin at 1pm and the program will follow, featuring a demonstration in gouache by Kesra Hoffman. A native of Middletown, MD, Kesra has been painting landscapes of her home and travels since 1996. Her medium of choice is gouache, a water-based and highly pigmented paint, for pieces in varying styles, on white or black paper. After earning her Bachelor of Arts in Studio Art in 1994 from Principia College, Kesra painted and studied art in Europe. After touring with cast E'95 of Up With People, she returned to Middletown to paint landscapes and teach private art lessons to kids and adults. A member of NOMA co-op gallery in Frederick, MD, Kesra is a full-time artist, painting landscapes and wall murals, binding books, and teaching classes, workshops, and private art lessons. As often as possible she travels worldwide, taking art trips and

painting workshops, and participating in plein air events, and incorporates these experiences into her artistic expression.

The Alliance's February meeting will be held on Saturday February 8 from 1-3pm (12:30 social time) at Grove Family Library (101 Ragged Edge Road South in Chambersburg). The business meeting will begin at 1pm and the program will follow, featuring a critique of members' works by Philip Lindsey. Philip teaches in both the undergraduate and graduate programs at Wilson College. He is the academic advisor for art & design undergraduates, and serves as a mentor to students in the MFA program. Philip earned his Master's of Fine Art degree at the Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, his Master's degree in painting and his Bachelor's degree in Art Education at Western Carolina University in NC. The recipient of numerous awards, Philip has exhibited widely over a thirty-year career, with works selected by major museum curators for national and international juried exhibitions in museums, galleries, and alternative spaces. A reception will be held Sunday Feb.2 from 2-4pm, and the show will be open Thurs. and Fri. from 10 AM - 3 pm through February 28. Call 717-264-1667 for more details. The Adams County Arts Council's 21st Annual Juried Art Exhibition will be held June 14-28, 2025 at Wolf House, United Lutheran Seminary Campus in Gettysburg, with an opening and awards reception on June 14th from 5-7pm, and delivery of work June 7 & 8 from 11am-2pm. **Entry deadline is Friday March 21**, and artists may enter up to 3 works completed within the last 3 years. The juror of selection & awards will be Ann Tarantino (MFA Painting, The Pennsylvania State University; BA Visual Arts (with honors), BA American Civilization, Brown University, Providence, RI); over \$3000 of awards will be made. Opportunities for learning

From the Chambersburg Council for the Arts Executive Director Sara Spitzer:

To Our Friends & Supporters: With deep regrets, and after much careful and difficult deliberation, the Board and staff of the Chambersburg Council for the Arts have unanimously decided to close our physical location effective December 31, 2024. We are deeply proud of the work we have been able to accomplish through our pioneering arts-education initiatives and our strong community partnerships. As we develop a vision for CFTA's future, we will continue to keep you informed.

These classes formerly held at the Council have moved to Coyle Library Community Room, 102 North Main St.:

Oil, Acrylic, Watercolor and Pastel Painting with Jeff Barnhart will be held from 1-4pm on Mondays January 6th, 13, 27 and February 3, 10, 24. Students will use the medium and subject of their choice, and Jeff will focus on painting technique and fundamentals that work regardless of medium. Students may work in oil, acrylic, watercolor, pastel or pen & ink. Jeff will offer occasional demos and lots of personal instruction. Previous experience in drawing or painting is required; this is not a beginner class. The cost is \$110 for the 6-week session and students will provide their own materials. Beginning Drawing will be held from 6-8 pm on Mondays 1/13-2/17. This basic drawing class is perfect for both beginner or intermediate artists who'd like to hone their skills. The class focuses on the development of concepts and elements of drawing: first and foremost, *observation*, then the compositional basics of line, form, value, texture, and spatial relationships. Sessions are oriented toward developing these fundamental artistic skills, understanding their application and exploring them through the use of various tools and materials. Examples will include learning how to draw still life, landscape, drapery studies and experimental problems. Includes problems of scale and proportion. The cost is \$100 for the 6-week session, and students will provide their own materials.

Figure Drawing will be held 6-8 pm on Tuesdays 1/14-2/18. This class will be a general introduction to the figure through observation and breaking down the various parts into shapes. We will include emphasis on proportion and value. Each session the first hour will be studying one area of the figure and the second hour drawing the entire figure.

Materials are a large 18x24 drawing pad, a drawing board, and vine charcoal sticks and choice of pencils. The cost is \$125 (extra \$25 is for model) for 6 sessions, and students will provide their own materials.

Color Theory (Color Smarts) will be held 6-8 pm, Thursdays 1/16-2/20. Color Theory is the study of the principles of additive and subtractive color in two-dimensional art. Students will utilize the visual elements and principles of design as they apply to color, and will focus on building everything from the three primary colors. The cost is \$100 for 6 sessions and students will provide their own materials

Intermediate Drawing I will be held 6-8 pm, Mondays, 2/24-4/7. While taking the Basics Drawing course prior to this is suggested, if you are confident enough in your basic observational drawing skills, you are most-welcome to attend! During this intermediate level class, students will continue to build on their foundational drawing skills and vocabulary explored in the basic drawing class of observation, line, form, value, texture and spatial relationships and begin to focus on more advanced techniques. There will be a focus on making combinations of the visual elements and principles of design with various materials to create finished compositions that begin to show personal style and expression. One or two classes will involve the use of a model. The cost is \$100 for the 6-week session, (includes model fee) and students will provide their own materials.

Cartooning will be held 6-8 pm, Tuesdays, 2/25-4/8. In this class we will develop the 'cartoon way of thinking,' satire, learn proper composition, line quality, the importance of simplicity, hand-lettering, caricaturing. Materials: any drawing paper, a drawing board, a ruler, pencils, ballpoint pens, sharpies, any other pens the student wants to try. The cost is \$100 for 6 sessions and students will provide their own materials.

Figure Drawing II will be held 6-8 pm Thursdays, 2/27-4/10, This class will be a continuation of Figure Drawing I, above, with some color added, and working on colored paper with charcoal and white chalk. We will introduce some color and study the figure in motion. Materials the same as I, plus white chalk, and colored drawing paper. The cost is \$125 (extra \$25 is for model) for 6 sessions, and students will provide their own materials.

Figure Drawing, ongoing group: This is a group meeting without instruction on Mondays from 10am-1pm at the Mansion House Art Gallery in Hagerstown. The usual session begins with gesture poses/sequence of brief poses, followed by 20-25 minute poses with short breaks every half hour. The professional model fee is \$20/hour split among four artists, that would be \$15 each. Because of increased gasoline costs, we have, on a voluntary basis, paying more than that. We pay the model in cash. If you are paying by check, the check would be made out to the model. Call Elaine Wolfe: (304)261-9583 (no text) with questions or to confirm attendance.
