An art educator for over 25 years, Karen is currently a signature member of the Maryland Pastel Society. She has won acclaim locally and nationally for her pastel paintings. *Dance of the Koi,* was selected as one of the top 100 paintings of the year from among 3,500 international entries in the Pastel 100 Competition of 2012 and was featured in the Pastel Journal. Karen has exhibited extensively locally and regionally in juried shows, notably in the Art of the State, Three Rivers Arts Festival Fine Arts Show, the Butler Institute of American Art annual show, the Biannual at the Westmoreland Museum of Art in Greensburg, PA and "Shades of Pastel" shows in Lorton, VA. and Rockville, MD.

Chambersburg's Foundry Art Market will present **Plein Air Chambersburg** on Saturday September 6th in downtown Chambersburg. \$1000 in awards will be presented by Judge Brienne Brown (www.briennembrown.com)

Location: Chambers Fort Park, North Main Street, Chambersburg Suggested painting subjects include North Square Farmers Market, waterfall, waterwheel, log cabin, Japanese Garden at the Old Jail, Streamside Gazebo at the Tower at Falling Spring, and the historic cemetery of Falling Spring Presbyterian Church. Artists should plan to bring their own easel and all equipment needed. Artists are welcome to explore the area and plan their work in advance, but must begin with blank canvas/paper, stamped at check-in. Artists will have 4 hours to create their plein air art piece/s and return to the registration area with their work and their easel, and one hour to prepare for display and judging.

Looking Forward: 2026 will be the 250th (Semiquincentennial) anniversary of our country's birth, and art institutions across the country will be organizing exhibitions to celebrate, among them Hagerstown's Washington County Museum of Fine Art. "A big part of our involvement in the national celebration will be our annual Cumberland Valley Artist show," WCFMA executive director Sarah J. Hall announced, "and we'd like artists to think about their subject matter now. Instead of our usual show, where artists submit any work of their choosing," she explained, "this exhibition will require submissions to be in line with four specific themes of national significance: Unfinished Revolutions, The Power of Place, Tell Everyone's Story, and American Experiment." The Cumberland Valley Artist 250th U.S. anniversary exhibition will run from November 8, 2025 to March 1, 2026. The specific time period for submissions will be released at a later date but will be between May 1 and June 30, 2025. (There will not be an FCAA Newsletter at this time: check their website!)

Proper framing of a miniature means using delicate frames, in proportion to the image – not standard frames! The MiniArt Supply company is having a closing sale, offering their framing supplies at 25% off. Check out their website: miniartsupply.biz. She takes credit cards, checks, or can send you a PayPal invoice.

Other supplies include small, short-handled brushes, and ivorine. Nancy says "We sell new ivorine that is <u>still</u> being made to-day. There is incorrect info on the internet that it is no longer manufactured." They offer several other surfaces as well, including vellum, gesso boards, piano keys, porcelain and bone boxes.
